Every month we honor the class that had the best attendance. So far this year, we are averaging just over 92% attendance. We are focusing a lot of our attention on our seniors. In years past, the sen-

iors class has had the lowest attendance of the four classes. This year's seniors are coming school with better frequency than last year's seniors, but have yet to win an attendance challenge. Last year as juniors. they had the best attendance in the school, so we expect a lot from this class. 
