Every year, Illinois public schools participate in the 5Essentials Survey. Our staff, students, and families are asked to complete the survey to give the school valuable information on how we are progressing in our service to

### **Bloom Trail— STAR Growth**

While the 5Essentials survey is open isn't the only time we are monitoring our progress. Throughout the year, we look at several data points to see if we are on-track. Recently we completed our winter STAR benchmark testing in reading and math. When comparing our students' fall and winter scores we look especially closely at their Student Growth Percentile (SGP). Every student has an individualized growth target based on their fall score,



and it compares them to other students of the same age and

achievement level nationally. According to STAR, achieving an individual SGP of at least 35% between testing periods is optimal. For our building, we set a goal of having our student earn an individual SGP of at least 50%. Well over 60% of our students reached this goal in both reading and math. This means that our students are making more

growth than and pushing ahead of their peers.
